Nowy Świat 69 Street, Entrance B, 1st floor, Room 109.

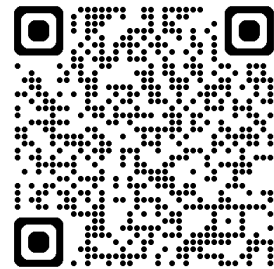
The lecture by Audrey Lair will be delivered via Zoom.
